

- 1) Stick this sheet onto an A4 sheet of card, if necessary.
- 2) Carefully cut out the top table.
- 3) Carefully cut out the four columns from this table.
- 4) Carefully cut along the top line of the bottom table. DO NOT cut off the side edges.
- 5) Carefully cut out the grey squares to form four windows.
- 6) Fold the table in half.
- 7) Put three staples along each dotted line and the edges to form four pockets into which the coloured strips can fit.
- 8) Insert the strips into the pockets in the order that they were printed.
- 9) Pull out each strip from its pocket so that the resistor colour is just at the edge. The resistor value can now be read from the windows.
